

Policy Title: Syllabus Changes

Scope: All Students / All Programs

1. PURPOSE & DEFINITION

- 1.1. To provide a mechanism for additions and revisions to the syllabus when deemed necessary by the Program
 - 1.1.1. Additions and revisions to policies are occasionally needed when unforeseen circumstances arise that require the schedule to be altered

2. WHEN REVISIONS WILL OCCUR AND WHY

- 2.1. Classes may be cancelled due to instructor unavailability, is in sickness or other emergencies or due to weather-related issues
 - 2.1.1. In this case, the class will be re-scheduled by the Program
 - 2.1.2. The Program will make every effort to arrange the schedule so as to inconvenience the students in the least possible way
 - 2.1.3. The Program may decide to add an additional session to the weekly schedule, extend the didactic schedule, or some combination
- 2.2. Revisions to the syllabus will be instituted when it is deemed by the Program to be in the best interest of the Program in general
 - 2.2.1. The Program's mission is to provide the highest quality educational experience for all students
 - 2.2.2. When it is deemed that a particular class is best taught by a specialist in that area (obstetric emergencies for example), the Program will accommodate the faculty who are often in high demand for their expertise

3. RESULTANT HARDSHIPS ON CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS

- 3.1. When a syllabus revision presents an undue hardship to a currently registered student in a currently running program, the student has five business days from notification of policy additions and/or revisions to notify the Program in writing of the nature of the hardship
- 3.2. The Program will review the hardship notification and will consult with the student to try and determine if an accommodation is warranted and possible
 - 3.2.1. Since the policies are designed to safeguard the students' educational experience and protect the integrity of the programs, accommodations are not guaranteed
